EARLY DETECTION SAVES LIVES START SCREENING TODAY

"If you are diagnosed with cancer, do not wallow or ask 'why me?' Instead, focus on the positives. Don't think too much and let loose." These are wise words from Mdm Peh Poh Choo, a 56-year-old breast cancer survivor to others who have also received an unexpected cancer diagnosis like her.

In 2008, she did a breast self-examination and felt a lump. Worried, she rushed to the polyclinic and was referred to Tan Tock Seng Hospital (TTSH) for further checks, including a breast biopsy. To her dismay, she was diagnosed with stage 1 breast cancer.

Over the course of her cancer treatment, she had to go through chemotherapy for a year and take oral drugs for five years. It was all worth it though, as Mdm Peh has been in remission since 2013.

In early 2019, Mdm Peh learned about the cancer screening services that Singapore Cancer Society (SCS) was offering through mailed flyers. As a cancer survivor, Mdm Peh signed herself up for both the Pap test and Mammogram screening as a

preventative measure. Fortunately, her results came back negative.

Mdm Peh is thankful that she discovered her cancer early, and strongly encourages all women to go for regular Pap tests and Mammogram screenings. These tests will ensure early detection of breast cancer and common gynaecological cancers, increasing the patients' chances for survival.

Leading by example, Mdm Peh is an enthusiastic advocate of early cancer screenings. Thanks to her encouragement, many of her friends have taken her advice and went for cancer screenings. Mdm Peh also intends to advise her daughter to get screened as soon as she is of suitable age.

Her message to the ladies,

"Do not be afraid of screenings, they are not painful."

In Singapore, 39 people are diagnosed with cancer every day. In fact, 1 in 4 people may develop cancer in their lifetime*

The prevalence of cancers among Singaporeans make regular screenings extremely important for detecting the cancer early. Early detection, screening, and diagnosis have been proven to significantly improve survival rates and patient's quality of life.

SCS provides Mammogram, Cervical Cancer Screening (Pap test/HPV test) and Faecal Immunochemical Test (FIT) at the SCS Clinic @ Bishan throughout the year.

We are heartened to see that there has been an increase in the number of screening participants at the clinic for cervical cancer and breast cancer screening in 2019.
