

2017 ACHIEVEMENTS AND FUTURE PLANS

We at Singapore Cancer Society (SCS) have much to be thankful for. More than 7,000 participants came together for last year's inaugural Singapore Cancer Society Relay for Life (RFL) 2017 event, and raised \$645,000. The 9th Singtel-Singapore Cancer Society Race Against Cancer 2017 also saw similar participation and raised a record sum of \$1.2 million in support of the cancer community.

The Singtel-Singapore Cancer Society Race Against Cancer (RAC) 2018 will be held on 22 July at the East Coast Park, Angsana Green. We look forward to your continued support as we celebrate the 10th Anniversary of RAC this year.

As a self-funded charity, SCS is dependent on public donations and our network of community supporters to provide support for critical cancer support and care for our beneficiaries. It is only with their generous support that we are able to make a significant impact on our cancer patients throughout their cancer journey.

Last year alone, we disbursed over \$3.98 million of financial aid to 2,258 beneficiaries through SCS' various support schemes. We are encouraged to see the growth of clients at SCS Cancer Rehabilitation Centre (CRC) @JEM, which has increased by 38% in 2017 compared to 2016. Colorectal, cervical and mammogram screening, available year-round and at no cost for eligible participants, have seen an increased uptake of 12-28%.

SCS, together with various stakeholders, will also be piloting new services as we move 'upstream' to focus on preventive work.

We are also ramping up on training and equipping SCS staff to improve capability and capacity to serve more and serve better. For example, the SCS-funded Prostate Cancer Specialist Nursing Programme, in partnership with Singapore General Hospital, Tan Tock Seng Hospital and National University Hospital, will train nurses to provide patients the full spectrum of care in their respective healthcare settings. This will help ensure the development of a 'holistic model of care' for prostate cancer patients.

With rising cancer incidence and an ageing population, more can be done. Stronger support is needed for the cancer community, especially when **35 people are diagnosed with cancer every day**, and **15 die of cancer daily in Singapore**.

We thank you for being a part of our journey and helping SCS achieve its goals. We look forward to working closely with you in 2018 to equip our stakeholders with more information and tools so that we can make a difference in the fight against cancer.

"Thank you for assisting me with Cancer Treatment Fund and financial assistance for my two daughters. I can focus on getting well without worrying about medical costs and my daughters' education. I am able to remain positive." SCS beneficiary, Mdm Irmawati.

> Irmawati was diagnosed with stage 4 breast cancer when she was 32 weeks pregnant with her second child. She had refused treatment fearing the safety of her unborn child, and endured back pain as the cancer metasised to the bone. She was prescribed morphine daily to manage the pain and underwent C-section at 34 weeks. After giving birth, she underwent 6 cycles of chemotherapy and hormone therapy

for 6 months.

SCS is supporting Irmawati with *Cancer Treatment* Fund for her CT scans, blood tests and chemotherapy. Her elder daughter, who is in Secondary School, receives aid from SCS Education Financial Assistance Scheme and tuition under SCS Help the Children and Youth Programme.

"We are very thankful for the financial assistance that SCS has been providing to us" SCS beneficiary, Mdm Samsiah and her husband, Mr Syed.



Mdm Samsiah was diagnosed with chronic myeloid leukaemia (CML) in 2011 when she was admitted to hospital after fainting. She was experiencing chronic headeache, nausea and vomitting. She now has to be on oral medication for life, to keep the cancer under control. She also has to go for blood tests and check-ups at the hospital every 3 months. Due to her poor health condition (giddiness, breathlessness, headache and lack of strength), she is not able to work. The cost of the oral medication is hefty, and the couple worry about the day when their CPF retirement funds and financial aid from the Government and welfare aid run out.

When she was first diagnosed, her response was "What will happen to my son?" Her son, now aged 39, is attending special needs school and not able to work to support himself. Her husband, now aged 71, has retired from his job as a security guard, and is helping to take care of her and her son. SCS has been supporting Mdm Samsiah with monthly financial assistance since 2016 under the SCS Welfare Aid Fund.

"Sometimes, I have breathlessness and numbness in my hands. But, when I'm drawing and colouring, my mind is focused and the discomfort goes away. I am happy. I feel young and free!" SCS Hospice Care Patient, Mdm Rosie Lok Chwee Har

Rosie had surgery eight years ago to remove 10cm of her colon when she was diagnosed with stage 4 colorectal cancer. In mid-2015, an X-ray revealed that the cancer had returned and spread to her lungs. Doctors told her that she had only 6 months to a year to live. She opted not to go for surgery or chemotherapy to avoid compromising her quality of life. She was then referred by a doctor from a hospital setting to **SCS Hospice Home Care** in late 2015.





Rosie is now attended to by a multi-disciplinary SCS team of medical and allied health professionals (Doctor, Nurse, Counsellor, Occupational Therapist and Art Therapist) who provide holistic hospice care for patients with advanced cancer in the comfort of their own homes. They visit her on a regular basis to help her cope with her pain and stress.

In May 2017, Rosie began her regular art therapy sessions at SCS. Now 86, she is living beyond her doctors' earlier prognosis. Instead of waiting for death, she nurtures her heart with art. Creating beautifully coloured artworks has helped her forget her pain, enabling her to pass time more meaningfully.

"Very grateful to SCS and donors who helped me regain some independence. I can now continue to repair watches and get out of the house." SCS Beneficiary, Mr Lim Kai Hon

Mr Lim was diagnosed with rectal cancer in 2007. He has had 4 major operations since then. He was working previously as a watch repairman and is now staying alone in a 2-room rental flat. He also suffered from a stroke in 2015 and hardly got out of the house due to difficulty walking and poor vision.

He was referred to SCS in 2016 by his medical social worker. SCS has been assisting him under the **SCS Welfare Aid Fund** with monthly supply of ostomy bags. With the help of corporate donors like Icon SOC Pte Ltd, he was gifted a motorised wheelchair and toolkit that now enables him to continue repairing watches at home and move around his neighbourhood conveniently.
