We accelerated our efforts in the first half of 2023 and are pleased to share the following achievements:

SINGAPORE CANCER

On 15th March 2023, we moved our headquarters and flagship Cancer Rehabilitation Centre to the new 24-storey National Cancer Centre Singapore (NCCS) building with its cancer care, rehabilitation, research, and education under one roof as a "one-stop"

destination for our patients and their caregivers. We have also begun utilising technologies, such as teleconsultation and wearable sensors in our

rehabilitation programme, so that patients can perform rehabilitation routines anywhere on their own time while enabling the clinician to track their progress remotely.

> Steadfast to our mission, we continue to provide HPV vaccinations to eligible females aged 18 to 26 who hold a valid CHAS orange or blue card.

On 21st May 2023, SCS kickstarted our community oncology rehabilitation services at Jurona Medical Centre with the National Cancer Institute of Singapore (NCIS). This partnership opened an avenue for holistic cancer rehabilitation and its supportive services to be accessible to cancer patients serviced by cancer patients served by the National University Health System (NUHS) cluster.

Last but not least, we clinched the Special Commendation Award for Governance and Management, making it our second Charity Transparency Award.

SCS has been spearheading the fight against cancer for the past 59 years. This endeavour would not have been possible without your continuous support. Your kind generosity keeps our lights on, enabling us to be there for our beneficiaries at every step of their cancer journey through a myriad of programmes and services.

Stage 4 Breast Cancer Warrior

When Snehal was first diagnosed with Stage 4 Metastatic Breast Cancer, she was shocked to learn that it had already spread to her lungs, liver, and bones. With her 4-month-old child in mind, Snehal mustered her courage and underwent hormonal therapy and 24 cycles of chemotherapy.

As her treatment progressed, Snehal's physical appearance began to change - "My hair started falling out, I was bloated, and I couldn't recognise the person in the mirror at all." Her self-esteem had taken a blow. The truth was, she had felt numb after diagnosis for a long time. However, with the gentle and loving support from both her husband and best friend, Snehal came to terms with her situation and found the strength to live her life whilst battling cancer. Today, Snehal is a life coach, tapping into her own experiences to help others find their paths in life out.

At Singapore Cancer Society, our 'Look Good Feel Good' programmes are specially curated for women undergoing chemotherapy and/or radiotherapy. These sessions aim to rebuild our patients' self-esteem through practical means such as conducting beauty workshops where ladies learn about alternative cosmetic techniques and hair alternatives. This enables our female cancer patients and survivors to better manage the physical changes brought about by cancer treatment.
